



Environmental Policy

Marina Adelaide recognizes that virtually all the activities of the company, and that of our customers, have some impact on the environment. It is our aim to minimize the impacts of the marina's operations on the environment through a program of continuous improvement whilst assisting our customers and staff to be responsible towards the marine environment.

The process is undertaken through International Environment Standard – ISO14001. Along with the system we comply with:

- The Environment Protection Act 1993
- The general environmental duty – Section 245 of the Act
- Compliance 3 with conditions of the EPA License, in particular condition 400-215
- Code of Practice for Vessel and Facility Management Marine and Inland Waters (2008)
- Marina Adelaide is an EPA Licensed Facility
- Marina and boating activities as described in the Environment Protection Act 1993 – schedule 1 part A8 (4)

The Marina Adelaide Environment Management System will ensure that the marina will:

- Acknowledge responsibility for our impacts on the environment
- Regard environmental considerations as fundamental and implement best practices to prevent pollution as an integral part of the operation and development of the business with at all times encouraging our customers and staff to form an integral part of the ongoing commitment
- Comply with current legislation and where practical seek to meet further legislative requirements ahead of relevant deadlines
- Seek continuous improvement on environmental performance through both internal and external audit programs
- Monitor all environmental impacts of the business
- Encourage all employees to address their environmental responsibilities within and outside the framework of their normal operating practices
- Work with tenants, berth holders and contractors to maintain awareness of environmental issues and assist them to maintain their impacts of their day to day operations
- Maintain a tidy and pleasant site as an important contribution to a well run business
- A detailed plan exists for a program in which relevant information is communicated to employees, tenants, contractors and the general public
- Develop appropriate emergency response plans for major incidents to minimize impacts on the environment and ensure that tenants, berth holders and staff are aware of these plans
- Develop best environmental practices in line with industry bodies such as Marina Industry Association of Australia, Boating Industry Association of South Australia
